Our local knowledge means that if the area that you are seeking advice on is beyond our remit, we can often direct you to the right source of support. such as via local authority colleagues. Please do not hesitate to get in touch .

Pastoral Leads

Each school is allocated a Pastoral Lead within our Principal Advisor and DDE Team. This person is a first port of call if you have a query and are unsure who to contact. The work of the Pastoral Lead generally focuses on supportive conversations with the headteacher and chair of governors. Please note that our Pastoral Leads are a listening ear with a great deal of education experience and expertise, but are not qualified counsellors and may advise you to access alternative support if the level of support needed is beyond their remit.

Please do reach out to your Pastoral Lead if something is troubling you and you would value a conversation. If you are unsure who is your allocated Pastoral Lead, please contact education@glosdioc.org.uk to confirm.

Services available to all our family of schools

SIAMS Support Visits

A SIAMS inspection is a key element of the life of a Church of England school. It explores the way that each school's individual theologically rooted vision drives its work and enables the school to live out its foundation as a church school. As such, a SIAMS inspection focuses on the very heart of the flourishing of church schools and is far from a tick box exercise to be picked up and put down in the year when an inspection is predicted. We would strongly encourage all schools to engage with our SIAMS course (see page) at appropriate phases of their cycle of inspections. In addition, we expect all our schools to engage in two visits offered by our Principal Advisors between inspections.

These are offered at specific times within the cycle of SIAMS inspections and are designed to support evaluation of areas covered by the SIAMS Inspection Questions and identification of next steps. We will contact you when you are due a visit to book in a suitable date.

SIAMS Monitoring Visit

This is typically scheduled mid-way through the cycle of inspections and is designed to offer an opportunity to consider progress since the last inspection and offer personalised advice in relation to next steps.

Pre-SIAMS Visit

This is typically scheduled in the academic year prior to the year in which a school is on the national likely list for inspection, and is an opportunity to receive advice to help you to ensure that you are confident and well-prepared for the inspection.

Where deemed necessary following a SIAMS inspection, additional bespoke support for improvement will be made available on a case-by-case basis.

Attendance at Inspection Feedback

Wherever possible, a Principal Advisor or the DDE will attend SIAMS and Ofsted feedback meetings to offer support and enable them to connect you to further support where relevant .

Services available to all our family of schools

Buildings Visits and Guidance

All church schools receive scheduled site visits from our Principal Advisor for Buildings, Admissions and Trusts. We will contact you when you are due a visit. Schools are not asked to make any additional preparations for these supportive visits. These visits last for 1.5 to 2 hours and focus on:

- Improving the GDBE's understanding of each school's site including buildings and land related issues
- Providing advice on any matters related to buildings and land, as well as sharing current relevant resources to support you.
- Reviewing the school's most recent building projects and discussing your future plans.

In addition, as part of our obligations under the DBE Measure, we expect all schools undertaking capital works above £5000 to obtain consent from the GDBE. This will enable us to advise and support you best. Attendance at PGM/SIG/RIG meetings

Where it is deemed necessary for a school to have a sequence of PGM or SIG (GCC) or RIG (South Gloucestershire) coordinated by the Local Authority, a Principal Advisor or the DDE will attend these meetings to ensure a joined up conversation about all aspects of the flourishing of the school and to ensure that the support available from the diocese is considered in the context of the PGM or RIG discussions. Typically, wherever possible, this will be the Pastoral Lead for the school.

Coordination of Bishop's Visitors

The Education Team support the work of the Bishop's Visitors who work on behalf of the Bishop. Support for Headteacher Recruitment

Effective leadership is key to the distinctively Christian flourishing of Church schools. We therefore expect to be invited to be fully involved in all headteacher recruitment processes, whether for interim or substantive posts, including executive roles. This includes involvement in setting recruitment criteria and involvement in shortlisting and interview days. Please contact us at the earliest opportunity when you are intending to design and initiate a headteacher recruitment process, so that we can offer advice and agree an appropriate level of involvement for a member of our team.

Brokering of Informal School-to-School Support within our Family of Church Schools

This includes signposting examples of good practice within our training sessions, including ILLUMINATE and making connections between schools working on an area of development and schools with good practice. It also includes connecting new headteachers with a peer for informal peer-to-peer mentoring support.

Induction & Lunch for new Headteachers

For Headteachers new to headship in a Church school

This essential induction session is held centrally. It will give you an overview of the distinctive nature of church school leadership and what it means to lead a church school. You will be introduced to the people and resources available to support you in your work. You will be welcomed by the Bishop and Diocesan Education Team, and will also get the opportunity to make valuable supportive connections with other colleagues new to headship in our schools. Booking of Courses

Unconscious Bias Training

Bias is Everywhere – But so is Change

For headteachers, senior leaders, collective worship leaders, all
governors

The Vision of the Church of England for its schools is for them to be deeply Christian places that serve the common good, enabling all to experience 'life in all its fullness' together (John 10:10). This means they need to be deeply inclusive spaces that enable all to flourish in community.

In recent ILLUMINATE sessions, we have thought together about learning from those who are dissimilar to ourselves and how the spaces we create can include or exclude others. We all carry unconscious assumptions about other people, which can influence our ability to connect with them, benefit from their skills, knowledge and perspectives, and best support their flourishing. Such unconscious assumptions can negatively impact the recruitment, retention and flourishing of valuable staff for your school.

The Diocese of Gloucester's Unconscious Bias course offers you the chance to explore how these biases affect not just the workplace but our day-to-day interactions, our decisions, and our views. It is an interactive and thought-provoking session, which is designed to help you understand the negative impact unconscious biases can have, recognize your unconscious biases and consider how to address them. This vital training will ensure you are able to recognise where there is a need for greater inclusivity within your environment.

Welcome to the Diocesan Church School Family

For Early Career Teachers (ECTs) and teachers new to Church schools

In response to feedback, we have reframed the format of our popular training offer for ECTs and teachers new to church schools, to make it more accessible to more participants from across the Diocese and more affordable for schools. This format also enables a deeper exploration of key elements of the life of church schools, meaning that ECT2s who have attended last year as ECT1s, may also find attendance valuable.

Introduction to Church School Leadership

For new & aspiring deputy headteachers and aspiring headteachers

Your school website is the way in which most people will form their first impression of your school. It is important that your website clearly shows that you are a Church of England School, through what is included and celebrated, with your school's Christian vision central and highly visible. A SIAMS inspector will use your website as part of the pre-inspection information gathering. This website review will provide you with a detailed report with suggestions for improvement to ensure your website is SIAMS inspection ready. There is the option of a telephone conversation to provide further clarification if required. (N.B. this will not cover the statutory website requirements covered by the LA website checks).

Church School Review

£400

We provide all our Church Schools with a fully funded programme of mid-cycle SIAMS monitoring visits and pre-SIAMS visits at no cost to the school. There may be particular circumstances where a school wishes to receive an additional monitoring visit outside the normal timescales for these visits. This could be, for example, where a monitoring visit has indicated significant areas of development where they would value additional feedback on progress, or where the school has experienced significant leadership turnover. These additional visits are called 'Church School Reviews'. Please contact the Diocesan Director of Education (jborgaud@glosdioc.org.uk) in the first instance if you would like to discuss the suitability and cost of this option for your school at the current time.

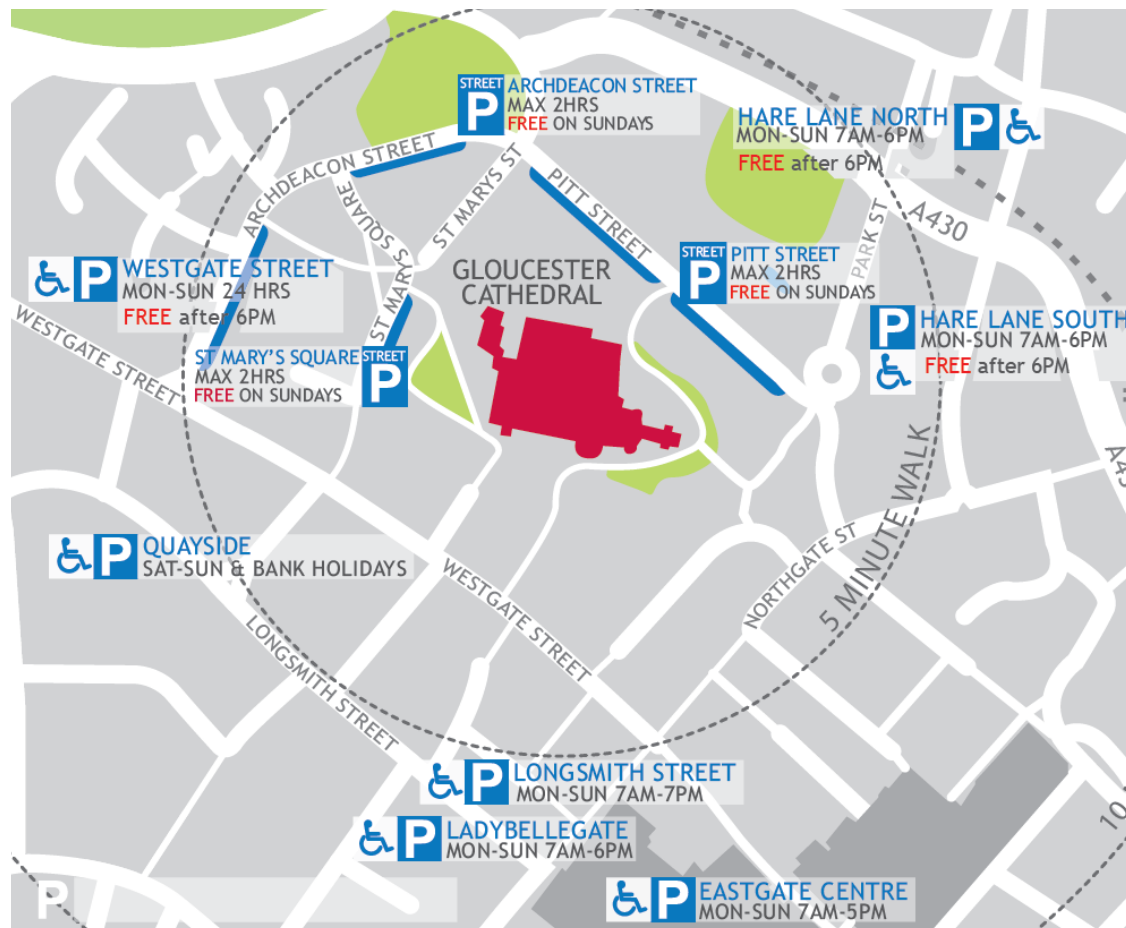
