Map of activities

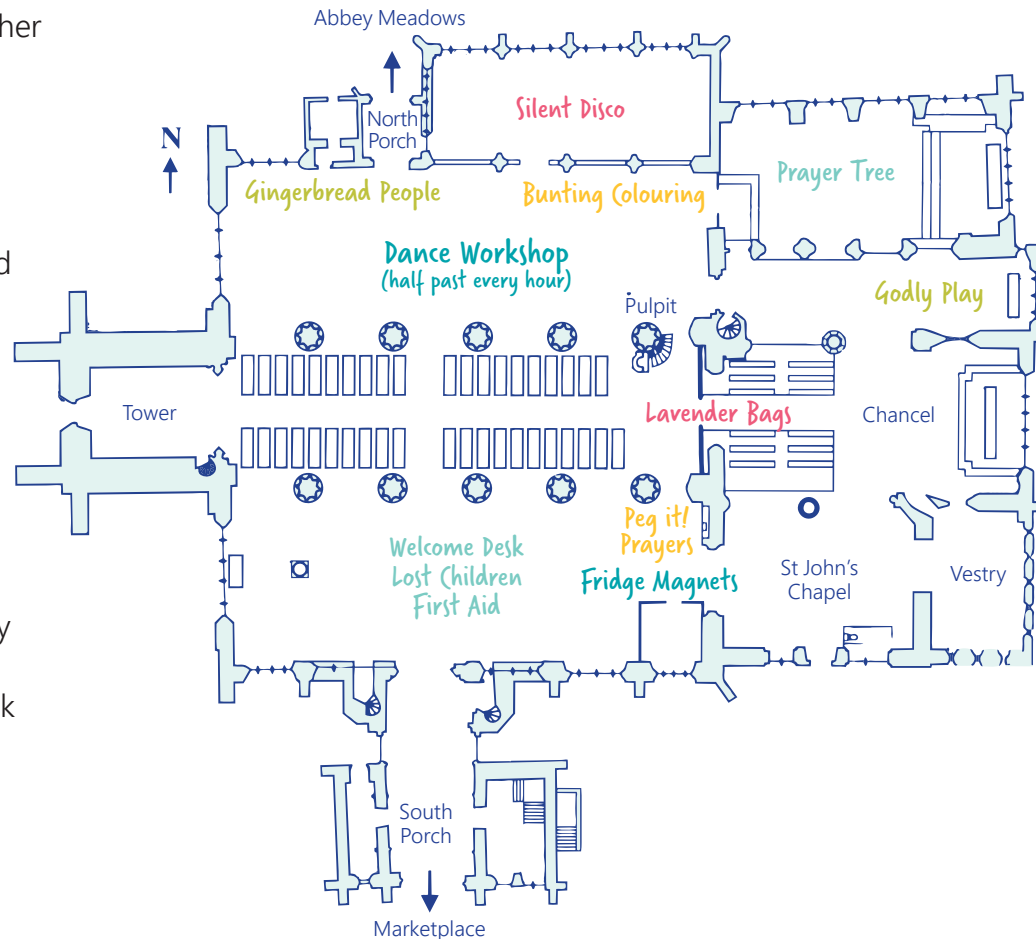

Gingerbread people: Icing and sprinkles galore. Recreate each other in gingerbread form.

Dance workshop: An inclusive workshop where anyone can take part to create a dance to share in our celebration worship at the end of the Faithful Generations Day. We will be exploring the different ways we talk with God using a mix of thoughtful and uplifting music and experiencing the awe and wonder of dancing in the wonderful setting.

Lavender bags: Scents can really spark memories of people and places; which scents help you think about special times and special people? How do people from different generations influence your life? If you would like to, use the materials provided to make a lavender bag to help you think about your relationships.

Fridge magnets: Create a fridge magnet and swap them as a promise to pray for each other.



Peg it!: Write or draw a prayer – who can you peg it to without them noticing? Keep on passing the prayer.

Prayer spaces: Use these creative spaces to share your hopes, dreams and passions. Reflect together on your relationship to God, each other, and the world.

Bunting colouring: The words we say about things really help us to understand them. Christians use lots of words to help them understand God and Jesus, words like love, peace, grace, just, life, hope, creativity, light, faithful, spirit, shepherd. What word or picture would you use to describe God? You can write your word and/or draw a picture on a flag to add to our colourful bunting.

DJ set: Join DJ Revd Steve who uses energising dance tracks to help us to learn about and worship God. Be prepared to dance!

Godly Play: People often talk about life as a journey. Come and hear the story of one family's journey and what they discovered about God and each other along the way.

Sheep hunt: Help! We have lost our sheep; they have hidden themselves all over the church. Jesus said he was like a good shepherd who searches even for one lost sheep. Can you search for our church sheep? There are 12, just like Jesus had 12 special friends.

Scavenger hunt: Really precious things are often kept in small boxes and shared from generation to generation. Our churches tell the precious story of who Christians believe God. Can you find these symbols around the church and add them to your treasure box? They will always help you to remember who God is.
